2.1	<p>Requirements for admission to the programme</p> <p>1. Consideration for admission to the degree programme Arts and Culture requires a Dutch or foreign diploma that demonstrates knowledge, understanding and skills at the level of a university Bachelor's degree and that shows its holder has the following specific knowledge, understanding, and skills:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">a) basic knowledge of theories, debates and research methods concerning Arts and Culture Studies;b) understanding of the functioning of Arts and Culture in historical context, contemporary culture and everyday practices;c) general academic skills, and in particular those needed to independently conduct research within the academic field of Arts and Culture;d) skills pertaining to oral and written proficiency in English at an advanced level. <p>2. The following conditions for consideration for admission apply to the various programmes.</p> <p><i>Programme: Applied Musicology</i></p> <p>Consideration for admission to the programme Applied Musicology requires:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- knowledge of and insight in (Western) music and its role within the cultural infrastructure, as well as appropriate skills in historiographical, music theoretical and/or cross medial research methods within musicology at BA level;- knowledge of the relevant research questions and methods in the field of (applied) musicology at BA level;- academic and analytic skills: the ability to design, carry out, and report both in writing and orally on (Western) music and its functioning in contemporary society, as well as with regard to questions relevant to music production, programming and participation;- skills pertaining to communicating research in musicology effectively into organizational practices and communicative formats as encountered in the cultural sector worldwide. <p><i>Programme Arts and Society</i></p> <p>Consideration for admission to the programme Arts and Society requires:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- knowledge of and insight in theories and topics pertinent to discourses on the evolving dynamic relationship between arts and society (e.g., the social turn in the arts, applied arts, art policy) at BA level;- knowledge of research methods in at least one of the following fields: applied arts, arts policy, cultural studies, media studies, literary studies, performance studies, sociology of the arts, or cultural anthropology at BA level;- academic and analytic skills: the ability to design, carry out, and report both in writing and orally on field or desk research in the arts and society field;- social and intercultural communication skills necessary for effective functioning in a variety of social and cultural contexts;- practical experience in the arts, e.g. through an internship or extracurricular

activities.

Programme Contemporary Theatre, Dance and Dramaturgy

Consideration for admission to the programme Contemporary Theatre, Dance and Dramaturgy requires:

- knowledge of and insight in theatre, dance and/or performance theory, history and/or dramaturgy at BA level;
- knowledge of research methods in the field of theatre, dance and/or performance studies as well as working knowledge of the use of the basic concepts used in the discipline at BA level;
- academic and analytic skills: the ability to design, carry out, and report both in writing and orally on research in the field of theatre, dance and/or performance studies; theatre and dance dramaturgy;
- professional skills: the ability to reflect on and query art practices and their societal contexts; social and communication skills in order to professionally collaborate and communicate with fellow students and arts professionals.

Programme Gender Studies

Consideration for admission to the programme Gender Studies requires:

- knowledge of and insight in gender studies and its epistemological foundations at BA level;
- knowledge of research methods in the field of the humanities and/or social sciences at BA level;
- academic and analytic skills: the ability to design, carry out, and report both in writing and orally on research in the field of gender and postcolonial studies;
- practical and/or professional experience in the field of gender studies, e.g. through an internship or extracurricular activities.

Programma Kunstgeschiedenis

3. Students will be selected on the basis of an assessment of the following core competencies:

- a) motivation and talent (also on the basis of GPA and student progress monitoring);
- b) level of required knowledge and the mastery of methods and techniques used in the subject area;
- c) general high level of professional and intellectual ability;
- d) command of the language(s) used in the programme.

This information is used to consider whether the student concerned is in a position to complete the Master's programme successfully within the nominal time period.

4. There is a fixed quota for admission to the programme Arts and Society. The maximum number of students to be admitted to this programme is 40. The Admission Committee referred to in Article 2.3 will rank the applications received using the criteria set out in the second paragraph and will accept applications for admission by their ranking.

<p>2.3</p>	<p>Admission procedure</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Admission decisions are made by the Admission Committee for 60 and 90 EC Master's Programmes of Utrecht Graduate School of Humanities, Chamber Master Degree Programmes (MA and RMA). 2. In order to determine eligibility for admission to the programme, the Admission Committee will carefully consider and evaluate the knowledge, insights and skills of the applicant. The committee may request experts within or outside the university to assess the applicant's knowledge, insights and skills in particular areas, in addition to a review of written documents of qualifications gained. 3. In order to determine eligibility for admission to a study programme within the programme, the Admission Committee will check if the applicant fulfills or will fulfill the requirements referred to in art. 2.1 before the established deadline. In its evaluation the committee will use the core competencies set out in art. 2.1 third paragraph when assessing, as well as the applicant's command of the language in which the programme is given. On the basis of this, the Admission Committee will assess whether the candidate is capable of demonstrating sufficient commitment to be able to achieve the Master's degree qualification within the prescribed period. 4. Admission assessments take place twice a year for the programme Arts and Society. The other programmes have a rolling admission between 1 October and <u>1 June</u>. 5. A request to be admitted to the study programme Arts and Society, must be submitted with the Admission Committee before <u>1 April</u>. A request to be admitted to one of the other programmes, must be submitted to the Admission Committee before <u>1 June</u>. For foreign students who need an early notification of admission, a request to be admitted to the study programme must be submitted to the Admission Committee before <u>1 February</u>. 6. The Admission Committee for the programme Arts and Society will make an admission decision within 6 work weeks after the application deadline (1 February or 1 April), but only on having received the complete file. The Admission Committee will make an admission decision for the other programmes within 20 working days from the date of receipt of the complete file. For foreign students who wish to apply for scholarships or who need an early notification of admission, a request to be admitted to the study programme must be submitted to the Admission Committee before 1 February. 7. The applicant will receive written notification that he/she has been admitted or not to the degree programme and a particular study programme. The possibility to appeal to the Examinations Appeals Board is pointed out in this notification. 8. For the programme Arts and Society the applicant will accept a notification of admission. A notification of admission that has not been accepted within two weeks will expire.

- C) is able to apply knowledge and insights in a manner which demonstrates a professional approach to his or her work and discipline;
- D) is able to communicate conclusions, as well as the relevant supporting knowledge and arguments to an audience comprised of either specialists or non-specialists.

Arts and Society

2. The graduate:

- A) has profound knowledge of and insight into the field of Arts and Culture, particularly of Arts and Society ;
- B) has thorough knowledge of a speciality within the study programme, or thorough knowledge on the interface of the study programme and another field;
- C) has the academic skill to identify, formulate, analyse and suggest possible solutions to problems independently in the field of Arts and Society;
- D) has the academic skill to conduct research on Arts and Society and report on it in a manner that meets the customary standards of the discipline;
- E) possesses professional and academic skills, particularly in relation to: Arts and Society;
- F) is able to apply knowledge and insight in a way that demonstrates a professional approach to his or her work or profession;
- G) is able to communicate conclusions, as well as the underlying knowledge, grounds and considerations, to an audience composed of specialists or non-specialists.

Contemporary Theatre, Dance and Dramaturgy

- B) has thorough knowledge of a focus area within the study programme, or thorough knowledge of a cross-section of the study programme and another field;
- C) has the academic skills to identify, formulate, analyse and suggest possible solutions to problems in the field of performance, theatre and dance studies;
- D) has the academic skills to conduct research in the field of performance, theatre and dance studies and report on it in a manner that meets the customary standards of the discipline;
- E) is able to apply knowledge and insight in a way that demonstrates a professional approach to his or her work or profession;
- F) is able to communicate insights and conclusions, as well as the underlying knowledge, grounds and considerations, to an audience composed of specialists or non-specialists.
