<b>PREPARATION</b>
exchange application process
The application was really easy and the study advisor helped a lot. only finding to good courses to take was more difficult. The course description from the receiving univerisity was not really clear. How the course worked and what it all was about was something you had to find out in Rome.
counselling & support at Utrecht University
The study adivisor helped with all the questions, it was also necessary to find out a lot by your self. This helped to understand everything better.
academic preparation
My level of english was sufficient enoug to partcipate in a university in Italy. I made sure that i liked the course which i choose. This made it easier to follow them.
language preparation
Language preparations where not necessary because i could use english. My study at the university in Utrecht was also in English
finances
I made sure i worked enough to pay for all my expenses. Also Duo is possible if you don't work as much as i did.

<b>STUDY ABROAD PERIOD</b>
study programme (content and organisational issues)
in the beginning it was hard, you should make your own timetable and look if it was possible with different time slots. You just had to find out which courses fitted into your time table, also they had to match with the requirments of the sending university. The university gives you two weeks to find out, so you can go to more courses the first week to look if you like them. After that week you can decide and subscribe to the courses.
academic quality of education activities
the quality is a little bit lower then in the Netherlands. If you do you best it is possible to score a 10 (30 points). In the netherlands it is almsit impossible to score a 10 as grade.
counselling & support at receiving university abroad
ESN; which is a group of students which helps students on exchange. They helped a lot with questions and where to go if we wanted answers. Luiss university also had a really kind student office which where always willing to help you.
transfer of credits
The credits where send to my home university with out a problem.

<b>PREPARATION</b>
exchange application process
I expected the application to be quite hard, but it was done in no-time. I chose Rome as first choice and after a while I got the message that my Exchange destination was Rome. Every step was clear and easy to submit.
counselling & support at Utrecht University
I spoke with the study advisor about my possible exchange and after this conversation, it was clear to me that it was possible to do an exchange within my study programme. Questions regarding the exchange were replied really quick by the exchange office. In this way, I had the feeling that I left the Netherlands well prepared.
academic preparation
I didn't really need a academic preparation. I just had to finish three more courses to finish my bachelor programme, therefore it was an easy choice to me which courses to take.
language preparation
Since my bachelor programme was completely in English, I didn't expect any troubles during the exchange. I had to do an English test up front and afterwards to check my level before and after exchange. For me, this was enough preparation and I had no problems with it during the exchange.
finances
I financed most of the semester by my own. I saved some money the year before. This in combination with the erasmus grant and the student loan was enough to live without any troubles. However, in my experience, 5



months of exchange is way more expensive than just 5 months in the Netherlands.

### STUDY ABROAD PERIOD

study programme (content and organisational issues)

I followed three courses (24 ECTS) since that was the amount I needed to graduate. This was quite easy to combine with an amazing social life. The classes were different than in Utrecht. All classes were lectures and therefore less interactive. Personally, I liked this way of teaching. Furthermore, the courses were more theoretical than in Utrecht. Materials were less focussed on the real world.

academic quality of education activities

In my opinion, the level of the courses is lower than in the Netherlands. The materials of the courses are more theoretical and less 'understanding'. Therefore, the way of learning is just different. Furthermore, the teachers were decent and classes were clear and useful.

counselling & support at receiving university abroad

There is an exchange office where you can go for all kinds of questions. Most of the questions, however, can be answered by the ESN board. The ESN board consists of students who organise everything and can help you with everything.

transfer of credits

ECTS are not transferred yet.

There was a introduction week full of activities to get to know the city, the university, clubs and most important: other exchange students. It was a fantastic week with parties, daytrips, tours etc. I would definitely recommend to participate.

accommodation

I found a place at [www.uniplaces.com](http://www.uniplaces.com). It took me just half an hour to find a place. However, I was quite on time (two months before departure). The house was clean and I lived with 6 other exchange students. It was without any troubles.

leisure & culture

Of course, the culture in Rome is amazing. You can easily fill half a year with walking around this city. There is always something to do. Relaxing in a park, a lot of sightseeing, visiting a match of football or going out for some drinks. Also ESN organises a lot of parties where you can go.

suggestions/tips

Safe enough money before the exchange. Say yes to (almost) everything. Things like trips and parties are completely different than when you are at home and therefore, you have to enjoy the time you are there! 5 months sounds like a long period, but time flies..

### PREPARATION

exchange application process

I decided late that I wanted to do an exchange. This was no problem whatsoever and fortunately I could go to Rome and had a wonderful time there

counselling & support at Utrecht University

Sometimes the receiving university was vague. University Utrecht was always there to answer my questions. They made it easy for me to get all the documents in order before I went to Rome.

academic preparation

The courses taught at University Utrecht are harder compared to the courses I took at LUISS. Therefore I did not struggle to keep up with the tempo and the material where other students of different countries did.

language preparation

My bachelors in english made it easy to follow the courses in Italy that were taught in English. In my opinion a English taught bachelor in the Netherlands is sufficient to obtain the necessary level of english.

finances

Duo + erasmus scholarship is not sufficient, save up some money. Or get a job while you are there. Maybe loan some of your parents/family.

study programme (content and organisational issues)

I took courses related to my bachelors. You can also choose to do unrelated courses, but for me it did not make sense since I know what I want to learn.

academic quality of education activities

Average, the courses taught at University Utrecht are more difficult. Also the attendance is not mandatory, which is nice if you can manage that.

counselling & support at receiving university abroad

Not that good. I had a hard time finding out who to contact whenever I had questions. It also took them a long time to get back in touch with me.

transfer of credits

I think the ECTS transfer directly, but I am not sure. The grading system is slightly different, you get a xx out of 30. Where 18/30 equals our 6. So divide it by 3 I guess

### PREPARATION

exchange application process

The application process is straightforward. The deadlines are clear, but it is your own responsibility to be on time and prepare well. However, I think this is a good thing, since you have to arrange things yourself throughout your Erasmus period. Furthermore, if you have questions, both the Utrecht and Rome Exchange offices will help you with your questions.

counselling & support at Utrecht University

The support is good and the USE Exchange office is always willing to help you.

academic preparation

It is recommendable to look closely at the courses you can follow and how they will be integrated in your study program. Therefore, I made an appointment with the academic counselor.

language preparation

LUISS offers a lot of academic courses in English, but learning (a bit of) Italian before you go will really help you with integrating and living in Italy.

finances

Living in Rome is not cheap. Especially housing is quite expensive (around €500 a month). I had a small buffer before I left and used the Erasmus grant, public transport compensation, government grant and government loan to finance my living. However, expect to spend a lot, since most of the time you feel like being on a holiday.

### STUDY ABROAD PERIOD



study programme (content and organisational issues)
The offer of (English) courses at LUISS is fine, but there is not as much choice as at the Utrecht University. However, in the end I followed quite interesting courses in my opinion. It is recommendable to pay attention when choosing your courses: they should not overlap with other courses you already followed in Utrecht and for me, most of them had to be level 3 courses. Making an appointment with the academic counselor to check these requirements is definitely recommendable.
academic quality of education activities
I think almost every Dutch student that went to the LUISS University will tell you that the academic level there is easier than in The Netherlands. However, it must be admitted that it depends on the courses you follow. Also, compared to other Italian private universities, LUISS is one of the best. The teaching method consists mainly of following lectures and not so much of doing projects.
counselling & support at receiving university abroad
I did not need the help of the International Office very often, but when I did (most of the time for getting the right signatures), they responded very quickly (via e-mail).
transfer of credits
The transfer of credits was completely transparent and I got my grade list right on time (I finished my exams in December).

welcome & orientation programme
The welcome programme offered by ESN (Erasmus Student Network) is really nice. In the beginning there are a lot of activities organised for you to meet fellow Erasmus students and explore the life in Italy and the city of Rome. My advise is to participate as much as you can in the first weeks, since you will be able to make so many new friends in that period.
accommodation
I arranged my room via CTS and got a reasonable place to stay at a great location. It is my advise to try to get a room close to the university, because public transport in Rome is not reliable. Also, be as quickly as possible in arranging a room, because when you are late it is not very easy to still get a good spot in Rome.
leisure & culture
Of course, Rome is the city of culture! It is not strange Rome is called an open-air museum, it has so many beautiful buildings, ruins, museums and churches. Every weekend I tried to do a cultural activity and do some sight-seeing, but at the end of my Erasmus period I still felt like I had not seen everything. Also, leisure is a big part of the Italian culture (they even have a saying for it: 'il dolce far niente', which means 'sweet doing nothing'). Good to mention: when the weather is still good, the beach is not far away (45 minutes approximately).
suggestions/tips

Experiencing a different culture is really valuable and in my view an important part of going on an Erasmus. A great way to quickly meet fellow Erasmus students from all over the world and do fun trips and parties.</li> <li>-Time flies when your having fun! Make the most of your Erasmus months and also try to see some other parts of Italy besides Rome.</li> </ul>
