FAQ Specialisations

Q: I can't choose because I don't know which direction I want to go. Can I postpone my choice?

A: Yes; however, we advise against postponing your choice because it will put you at significant risk of falling behind. You cannot enrol at a later date in the year. At least attend the information events and discuss your programme with the tutor if this is the case.

Q: I forgot to enrol in the courses for a specialisation. Now what?

A: Contact your Study Advisor immediately.

Q: I'm not sure if I will obtain my BSA; do I still need to enrol in a specialisation?

A: Yes, go ahead and enrol.

Q: I enrolled in the courses for a specialisation but in the meantime I have decided against taking it. What do I do now?

A: If you wish to unenrol, you can report to the <u>Humanities Faculty Student Desk</u>. Unenrolling in the specialisation also has consequences for your course enrolment. You cannot simply enrol in a different specialisation. You will need to discuss the matter with the Student Desk staff members.

Q: Due to circumstances for which I can provide proof are beyond my control, I am unable to take all of the courses in the specialisation this year. Can I complete the specialisation later?

A: Please contact your Study Advisor in order to register the circumstances beyond your control and to discuss your course planning

Q: I completed the first course in the specialisation but have concluded that this specialisation is not the right one for me. Now what?

A: Discuss the available options with the tutor.

Q: I want to put together my own specialisation. Is that possible?

A: No. The degree programmes have compiled fixed, coherent specialisations. Finishing a complete specialisation is a condition for graduation.
