<b>2.1</b>	<p data-bbox="354 310 987 342"><b>Requirements for admission to the programme</b></p> <p data-bbox="354 373 1377 541">All students who start their Master’s programme on the 1st of September 2016 or later, will encounter a selection procedure which must be completed successfully in order to enrol in the programme. In the course of the current academic year (2015-2016) information will be made available on the selection criteria and procedure for each Master’s programme. Keep an eye on the webpages of the programme’s you have taken an interest in for updates.</p> <p data-bbox="354 573 1360 657">The holder of a Dutch or foreign higher education degree who demonstrates knowledge, insight and skills in the following fields will be admitted to Nederlandse letterkunde:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li data-bbox="354 699 1344 814">a) BA-degree (or equivalent) in the Humanities; a clear interest in Dutch literary studies (Nederlandse letterkunde) as evidenced in a minimal of 45 ECTS in a relevant field at BA level; preferably Dutch literary studies (Nederlandse letterkunde).</li> <li data-bbox="354 814 1377 867">b) Knowledge of basic concepts in Dutch literary studies (Nederlandse letterkunde) and insight into relevant methods.</li> <li data-bbox="354 867 1360 930">c) A high standard of academic achievement as evidenced in academic transcripts and references.</li> <li data-bbox="354 930 1084 961">d) Intellectual curiosity and motivation for further research.</li> <li data-bbox="354 961 1052 993">e) Outstanding oral and written language skills in Dutch.</li> <li data-bbox="354 993 1344 1045">f) Ability to use English as a working language within academia, both orally and written.</li> </ul>

<b>2.5</b>	<p data-bbox="402 1192 686 1224"><b>Admission procedure</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li data-bbox="354 1266 1352 1318">1. Admission decisions are made by the Admission Committee Utrecht University Graduate School of Humanities, Chamber Research Masters.</li> <li data-bbox="354 1318 1377 1465">2. In order to determine eligibility for admission to the programme, the Admission Committee will carefully consider and evaluate the knowledge, insights and skills of the applicant. The committee may request experts within or outside the university to assess the applicant’s knowledge, insights and skills in particular areas, in addition to a review of written documents of qualifications gained.</li> <li data-bbox="354 1465 1377 1644">3. In order to determine eligibility for admission to a study programme within the programme, the Admission Committee will check if the applicant fulfils or will fulfil the requirements referred to in art. 2.1 before the established deadline date. In its evaluation the committee will consider the applicant’s motivation and ambition with respect to the study programme in question, as well as the applicant’s command of the language in which the programme is given.</li> <li data-bbox="354 1644 1385 1707">4. For this Master’s programme, a ‘rolling admission’ procedure is applicable. At any time during the registration period, an application for registration can be done.</li> <li data-bbox="354 1707 1377 1898">5. Admission assessments take place twice a year. A request to be admitted to the study programme must be submitted with the Admission Committee before 1 December for foreign students who wish to apply for scholarships or who need an early notification of admission. For study programmes starting on 1 September, students need to apply between 1 October and <u>1 April</u>. Citizens from EU countries, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Monaco, Norway, Vatican or Switzerland, may also apply between 1 April and 1 June, but admission cannot be</li> </ol>

	<p>guaranteed. For study programmes starting on 1 February, students need to apply before 1 September. Citizens from EU countries, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Monaco, Norway, Vatican or Switzerland, may also apply between 1 September and 15 October, but admission cannot be guaranteed.</p> <p>6. The Admission Committee will make an admission decision within 3 weeks after having received the complete file. Admission will be granted on the condition that by the starting date of the study programme the applicant will have satisfied the knowledge and skills requirements referred to in Clause 2.1, as evidenced by certificates of qualifications.</p> <p>7. The applicant will receive written notification that he/she has been admitted to the degree programme and a particular study programme. The possibility to appeal to the Examinations Appeals Board is pointed out in this notification.</p>
<b>3.1</b>	<p><b>Aim of the programme</b></p> <p><u>The programme aims to:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• provide specialised knowledge, insight and skills in the field of Dutch literary studies (Nederlandse letterkunde);</li> <li>• prepare students for a career as a researcher in the field of Dutch literary studies (Nederlandse letterkunde) <i>in the broadest sense</i>, with an emphasis on the early-modern and modern period;</li> <li>• prepare students for a PhD programme in the field of Dutch literary studies (Nederlandse letterkunde).</li> </ul> <p><u>The graduate:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• has profound knowledge of and insight into the field of Dutch Language and Literature, particularly of the chosen area of specialisation;</li> <li>• has thorough knowledge of a specialism within the programme, or thorough knowledge at the interface of the programme and another field;</li> <li>• has the academic skills to independently identify, formulate, analyse and suggest possible solutions to problems in the field of Dutch Language and Literature;</li> <li>• has the academic skills to conduct research in the field of Dutch Language and Literature and to report on it in a manner that meets the general standards of the discipline;</li> <li>• possesses professional and academic skills, particularly in relation to: Dutch Language and Literature;</li> <li>• is able to apply knowledge and understanding in a way that demonstrates a professional approach to his/her work or profession;</li> <li>• is able to communicate conclusions, as well as the underlying knowledge, grounds and considerations, to an audience composed of specialists or non-specialists.</li> </ul>
<b>3.2</b>	<p><b>Attendance mode</b></p> <p>The programme is full-time.</p>
<b>3.3</b>	<p><b>Language in which the programme is taught</b></p> <p>The programme is taught in Dutch, but some parts will be taught in English. This is governed by the Utrecht University Language Code of Conduct.</p>
<b>3.5</b>	<p><b>Study programme; starting time</b></p> <p>The programme starts twice a year: on 1 September and on 1 February.</p>
