3.1	Purpose of the degree programme
	From the first year of the Bachelor's degree, students are familiarised with the theory and practice of academic research.

The programme aims to provide:  • knowledge, skills and understanding in the field of History, and the acquisition of the exit qualifications outlined in the second paragraph;  • general academic education, defined as the development of competencies (knowledge, skills and attitudes) with respect to:  - academic modes of thought, conduct and communication;  - using relevant academic tools and instruments;  - academic and other forms of communication in the language in which the programme is taught;  - application of specific field-related knowledge within a broader academic, philosophical and sociocultural context;  - codes of conduct applicable during students' studies and academic careers in general;  • preparation for an ongoing academic career;  • preparation for professional practice:  - by relating knowledge of the past to current events;  - through career exploration.  2. Graduates:  1. have knowledge and an understanding of the past;

3.2	Programme format
	The BA History is a full-time programme.
3.3	Programme language
	The programme is taught in English. All assessments take place in English.
3.5	Major
	The History programme has two tracks: 1. History; 2. International relations in historical perspective.
	Students choose a specialisation from among those offered within the relevant track (see also the Curriculum (appendix 1 A)).
	1. One portion of the programme consists of the major, which has a study load

- of 120 EC in history subjects. Within the major, the courses listed in Appendix 1, having a total study load of 67,5 EC, (excluding the thesis, see paragraph 2) are compulsory.
- The major includes a thesis having a study load of 7,5 or 15 EC at an advanced level (3) (see Appendix 1). This completed thesis serves as an aptitude test of the required knowledge, skills and attitudes.
- 3. The remaining courses for the major, including the 30 EC specialisation, are to be chosen by students from among the courses listed in Appendix 2.
- 4. The major includes courses that are related to the academic and social context of history. These courses are listed in Appendices 1 and 2.
- 5. The programme components that fall within the major must include at least 45 EC in advanced level (3) courses.

Students who commenced their studies in a previous academic year must complete the curriculum as described in the OER Appendix for the year in question. As certain curricular components are no longer offered in this academic year (2020-2021), transition provisions apply (see Appendix 7).

## 4.7 Evaluation of quality of the education

- The Director of Studies is responsible for monitoring the quality of the
  courses and teaching. To this end the Director of Studies will ensure that
  quality assurance involves evaluating courses and an evaluation at
  curriculum level. In ensuring the quality of courses the Director of Studies
  will draw on the advice and suggestions for improvement of the curriculum
  committees on promoting and safeguarding the quality of the course.
- The courses and teaching in the degree programme will be evaluated using one or more of the following means:
  - interim evaluation during the course: during the course students can provide feedback on aspects that could possibly be different or better;
  - course evaluation: at the end of the courses, the participating students are asked for their opinion on the quality of the contents, educational structure, study materials, testing and lecturer(s) through the digital survey system;
  - evaluation at curriculum level: through curriculum dialogues (in Dutch onderwijsgesprekken)
  - by means of the National Student Survey (Nationale Studenten Enquête – NSE) the students will be asked for their opinion on all aspects of the courses, teaching and the facilities.
- Students who have participated in courses offered by the Faculty of Humanities will be informed of the results of the course evaluations.
