Information levels

Level	Level description
1	Bachelor Introductory: broad introduction to the subject. You don't need any specific background knowledge, courses are mostly followed by 1st year students.
2	Bachelor Elaborating: exploring aspects of the subject, current debates, specific methods and techniques. Depending on the course, specific background knowledge may be needed as are specific academic skills.
3	Bachelor Advanced: integration/synthesis, formation of theories based on research results. You must have sufficient background knowledge in the subject area.
