WHAT DO I NEED TO KNOW ABOUT ENROLLING IN COURSES?

In high school, you had subjects, but at university, you have courses. You register for courses through Osiris during a **designated registration period**. First-year students are usually automatically enrolled in the mandatory courses for the first year.

Note: Registration periods can sometimes be as early as six months in advance, so make sure to mark the dates in your calendar and plan ahead. Registration periods can also vary by faculty. Keep this in mind if you are taking elective courses from a different faculty.

Timeslots
At UU, we use timeslots. To prevent your lectures, tutorials, or exams from overlapping, you need to schedule your courses in different timeslots. Timeslots allow you to create a manageable schedule.

TIPS

- ▶ **Study spots:** study places at various locations in Utrecht
- ▶ **Studium Generale:** free academic knowledge in the form of lectures, talk shows and other events.
- ▶ **Olympos:** sports centre with a wide range of sports and fitness activities. Your OlymPas entitles you to a discount on sports and fitness fees.
- ▶ **Parnassos:** cultural centre that offers a wide range of courses, productions and workshops.
- ▶ **@humanitiesuu:** follow Faculty of Humanities on Instagram for student news and events.
- ▶ **Printing:** use any card with an RFID chip (e.g. your OV chip card), top up your print credit via [myprintportal](#).

Tutor: personal contact point for questions about your program or personal issues.

Student mentor: senior students sharing their experiences to help you.

Lecturer: questions about assignments, grades, and evaluations.

Study advisor: questions about your study program, studying with a disability, and personal issues affecting your studies.

Study association: each program has an association that organizes training and social activities.

Board of Examiners: granting exemptions, additional retakes, and approving credits earned outside UU.

Curriculum Committee: advises the program on the quality of education in the interest of the students.

Wellbeing Trainers: support and guidance in nurturing good health and wellbeing.

Student Services: enrolment, tuition, financial assistance, housing and Studielink.

WHICH DIGITAL TOOLS DO I NEED?

Login

Solis-ID: your user name for university services, that corresponds to your student number.

2FA: UU secures data using two-factor authentication (2FA). You need three things to log in using 2FA: your Solis-id and password, and your smartphone or tablet.

Wifi: Utrecht University, log in using your e-mail address and Solis-id password.



Registration & schedules

Osiris student: this is where you can register for courses, see your grades and change your address details.

Course planner: to plan out your studies and have an overview of all courses included in your programme.

MyTimetable: scheduling website, log in with Solis-id, your schedule is automatically in it.

MyUU: app for students featuring your grades from Osiris, your Digital Student Card, your library card and your personal schedule.

Study Support

Blackboard: learning environment for handing in assignments and finding lecture materials and information about courses.

Outlook: you will receive important information from lecturers and university administrators via your student email address.

Solis Workspace: offers all the applications you need for your courses.
