

Changes and additions Master's Education and Exam Regulation 2020-2021:

Changed regulation
Paragraph 2.3.4 changed as follows:
A request to be admitted to the Master's degree programme and a specific programme must be submitted to the Board of Admissions before the relevant deadline on the prospective student website (www.uu.nl/masters or www.uu.nl/internationalmasters). Requests submitted after these deadlines will not be considered. The decision not to process the request refers to the possibility of appeal to the Examination Appeals Board.
Paragraph 3.8.5.e
The conversion table in the Sustainable Development Joint Program is no longer in use according to recent decision-making.
Additional regulation
Article 2.1a – Admission and conditional enrollment due to Covid 19
<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Contrary to the provisions of Paragraph 2.1 the Board of Admissions may decide to admit to the two year Master's degree programme applicants starting 1 September 2020 who meet the following conditions:<ol style="list-style-type: none">a. The candidate bachelor's examination programme is lacking no more than 15 credits;b. The candidate submits an application form that is provided for that purpose by 16 August 2020 at the latest in which:<ul style="list-style-type: none">• it is indicated which Bachelor's components the candidate was unable to complete in block three and four of the academic year 2019-2020;• it is indicated that this delay is linked to the government measures related to COVID-19;• a study plan is included in which it is indicated how the candidate will combine the missing Bachelor's components with attending the Master's degree programme.c. The applicant belongs to one of the following groups:<ul style="list-style-type: none">• students enrolled for a Bachelor's degree programme at the UU;• students enrolled for a Bachelor's degree programme at another Dutch university (or university of applied sciences if an hbo Bachelor's degree gives access to the Master's degree);• students enrolled for a Bachelor's degree programme at a university in an EEA country;• students enrolled for a Bachelor's degree programme at a university outside an EEA country with a residence status or awaiting a final decision on their application.2. The Board of Admissions assesses:<ul style="list-style-type: none">• whether the conditions set out in the first paragraph have been met, and• whether, in the opinion of the Board of Admissions, the applicants studyplan has a reasonable study load.Applicants who meet both conditions receive a letter of acceptance to the Master's degree programme.3. Applicants who have been admitted on the basis of the first and second paragraph must pass the Bachelor's examination by 1 September 2021 at the latest. If the Bachelor's degree is not awarded before this date, re-enrolment for the Master's degree programme in the 2021-2022 academic year is not allowed.4. Applicants admitted on the basis of the first and second paragraph are not allowed to start with the Master's final thesis if the bachelor's final thesis has not yet been completed.5. Decisions relating to admission based on this article refer to the possibility of appeal to the Examination Appeals Board.
art. 3.9a - destination with negative travel advice

1. Components for which the student must travel to areas abroad or the Caribbean part of the Kingdom for which the Ministry of Foreign Affairs has given a travel advice of classification red (do not travel) or orange (only necessary travel) during the period that the course will be followed, cannot be entered in the degree programme.
2. On behalf of the Dean, the provisions of the first paragraph may be deviated from in exceptional circumstances. Permission can only be given in case:
 - it concerns an obligatory part of the study,
 - for which there is no alternative, and
 - it is necessary that this is followed, and
 - there are, in the opinion of the UU, sufficient guarantees that safety and health are guaranteed.
