

## **ADDENDUM to the one-year Master-EER 2021-2022**

ADD TO THE EER OF THE ONE-YEAR MASTERS:

### **Article 2.5 - Admission and conditional enrolment in connection with COVID-19**

1. Contrary to the provisions of Article 2.1 (admission requirements for study programmes) and Article 2.3 (admission procedure), the Admissions Committee may admit candidates who meet the following conditions with effect from 1 September 2021:
  - a. The Bachelor's programme or the pre-Master's programme has been completed except for a few components of which the total study load does not exceed 15 credits;
  - b. The applicant shall submit an application for admission using the form provided for that purpose by 31 July 2021 at the latest:
    - it is indicated which Bachelor's components or pre-Master's components the applicant was unable to complete;
    - it has been indicated that this delay is linked to the government measures related to COVID-19;
    - a study plan is included in which it is indicated how the applicant will combine the achievement of the missing Bachelor's components or pre-Master's components with attending the Master's programme.
  - c. The candidate belongs to one of the following groups :
    - students enrolled for a Bachelor's degree or a pre-master's programme at the UU;
    - students enrolled for a Bachelor's degree at another Dutch university (or university of applied sciences if an hbo Bachelor's degree gives access to the Master's degree);
    - students enrolled for a Bachelor's degree at a university in an EEA country;
  - d. Additionally for the Master's programme Psychology: Clinical Child and Adolescent Psychology, the following competences must have been obtained before the start of the Master's programme:
    - in-depth knowledge of aetiology (determinants and contributing factors), symptomatology prognoses and treatment of developmental problems and psychopathology - focusing on child and youth populations - based on recent insights. You are able to critically reflect on cases of problematic development.
    - understand and apply decision making models, procedures, and psychological assessment instruments to (systematically) conduct the assessment process from initial problem to diagnosis and recommendation. This should include assessment on child and adolescent populations.
2. The regulation included in the first paragraph does not apply to:
  - Students who need a visa to study at Utrecht University;
  - The Master programme's Pedagogical Sciences: Clinical Child, Family and Education Studies, Psychology: Applied Cognitive Psychology and Psychology: Neuropsychology
3. The Admissions Committee assesses:
  - whether the conditions set out in the first paragraph have been met, and
  - whether, in the opinion of the Admissions Committee, there is a studyable programme in combining obtaining the missing Bachelor's components or pre-Master's components with attending the Master's programme.

The candidate who satisfies both conditions will receive a definitive admission decision.
4. The candidate admitted pursuant to paragraphs 1 and 2 must pass the Bachelor's examination or must complete the pre-Master's programme by 1 September 2022 at the latest. If the Bachelor's examination was not obtained before that date or if the pre-Master programme was not completed before that date, re-enrolment for the Master's programme in the 2022-2023 academic year is not possible.
5. Candidates admitted on the basis of the first and second paragraphs may only take part in the Master's component referred to below if the Bachelor's component referred to below has been completed, or if the candidate possesses the competences referred to below:

6. Candidates admitted on the basis of the first and second paragraphs may not take the final examination of the Master's programme if the bachelor's programme or the premaster programme has not yet been completed.
7. Decisions relating to admission pursuant to this article may be appealed to the Examination Appeals Board. The candidate will be made aware of this in the decision of the admissions committee.

### **Article 2.6 - Admission to the premaster programme in connection with COVID-19**

1. Contrary to the provisions of Article 2.4 (admission procedure) and Annex 1.1, 1.2, 1.3, 1.4 and 1.5 (admission requirements and content of the premaster programme), the Admissions Committee may admit candidates to the premaster programme who meet the following conditions with effect from 1 September 2021:
  - The programme of the University of applied sciences (hbo) has been completed except for a few components of which the total study load does not exceed 15 credits;
  - The applicant shall submit an application for admission using the form provided for that purpose by 31 July 2021 at the latest:
    - it is indicated which courses of the University of applied sciences (hbo) the applicant was unable to complete;
    - it has been indicated that this delay is linked to the government measures related to COVID-19;
    - a study plan is included in which it is indicated how the applicant will combine the achievement of the missing components of the University of applied sciences (hbo) with attending the pre-Master's programme.
2. The regulation included in the first paragraph does not apply to the pre-Master's programme Clinical Child, Family and Education Studies.
3. The Admissions Committee assesses:
  - whether the conditions set out in the first paragraph have been met, and
  - whether, in the opinion of the Admissions Committee, there is a studyable programme in combining obtaining the missing components of the University of applied sciences (hbo) with attending the premaster programme.

<sup>1</sup> Applicable only to the Master's study programmes Cultural Anthropology: Sustainable Citizenship, Interdisciplinary Social Science: Social Policy and Public Health, Interdisciplinary Social Science: Youth Studies, Pedagogical Sciences: Youth, Education and Society, Psychology: Clinical Child and Adolescent Psychology and Psychology: Social, Health and Organisational Psychology.

<sup>2</sup> For the Master's study programme Cultural Anthropology: Sustainable Citizenship applies that the Bachelor's thesis or the pre-Master's Thesis must be completed by 31 December 2021 at the latest in order to participate in the Master's Thesis. For the Master's study programmes Youth Studies and Youth, Education and Society applies that the Bachelor's thesis or the pre-Master's Thesis must be completed by the start of block 2 in order to participate in the Master's Thesis. For the other Master's study programmes mentioned in note 1, the Bachelor's thesis or pre-Master's Thesis must have been completed before the start of block 3 in order to take part in the Master's Thesis.<sup>3</sup> Applicable only to the Master's study programme Pedagogical Sciences: Youth Education and Society.

4. The candidate admitted pursuant to paragraph 1 must pass the examination of the University of applied sciences (hbo) by 1 September 2022 at the latest. If the examination of the University of applied sciences (hbo) was not obtained before that date, re-enrolment for the premaster programme and enrolment for the master's degree programme in the 2022-2023 academic year is not possible.
5. Decisions relating to admission pursuant to this article may be appealed to the Examination Appeals Board. The candidate will be made aware of this in the decision of the admissions committee.
