2.3	<p>Admission to the study programmes</p> <p><i>Ancient, Medieval and Renaissance Studies</i> The holder of a Dutch or foreign higher education degree who demonstrates knowledge, insight and skills in the following fields will be admitted to the programme Ancient, Medieval and Renaissance Studies:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) BA-degree (or equivalent) in the Humanities; b) A clear interest in Ancient, Medieval, Celtic or Renaissance Studies as evidenced in a minimal of 45 ECTS in a relevant field at BA level; c) Knowledge of basic concepts in Ancient, Medieval, Celtic or Renaissance Studies and insight into relevant methods; d) A high standard of academic achievement as evidenced in academic transcripts and references; e) Intellectual curiosity and motivation for further research; f) Ability to use English as a working language. Dutch students must have a diploma in English at pre-university level; foreign students from non-English speaking countries, see 2.2 of the faculty part of the EER. <p>Admission to the study programme also requires:</p> <p>The strict minimum of 45 ECTS in the fields of either Ancient, Medieval, Celtic or Renaissance Studies is mandatory; also mandatory are the requirements of demonstrable knowledge of research questions, methods and basic concepts in either one or another of these fields.</p> <p><i>Modern History 1500-2000</i> The holder of a Dutch or foreign higher education degree who demonstrates knowledge, insight and skills in the following fields will be admitted to programme Modern History 1500-2000:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) BA-degree (or equivalent) in the Humanities; b) A clear interest in historical science, as evidenced in a minimal of 45 ECTS in a relevant field at BA level; c) Knowledge of basic concepts in historical science and insight into relevant methods; d) A high standard of academic achievement as evidenced in academic transcripts and references; e) Intellectual curiosity and motivation for further research; f) Ability to use English as a working language. Dutch students must have a diploma in English at pre-university level; foreign students from non-English speaking countries, see 3.3.
2.5	<p>Admission procedure</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Admission decisions are made by the Admission Committee Utrecht University Graduate School of Humanities, Chamber Research Masters. 2. In order to determine eligibility for admission to the programme, the Admission Committee will carefully consider and evaluate the knowledge,

	<p>insights and skills of the applicant. The committee may request experts within or outside the university to assess the applicant's knowledge, insights and skills in particular areas, in addition to a review of written documents of qualifications gained.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 3. In order to determine eligibility for admission to a study programme within the programme, the Admission Committee will check if the applicant fulfils or will fulfil the requirements referred to in art. 2.3 before the established deadline date. In its evaluation the committee will consider the applicant's motivation and ambition with respect to the study programme in question, as well as the applicant's command of the language in which the programme is given. 4. For this Master's programme, a 'rolling admission' procedure is applicable. At any time during the registration period, an application for registration can be done. 5. Admission assessments take place during a year. A request to be admitted to the study programme must be submitted with the Admission Committee before 1 December for foreign students who wish to apply for scholarships or who need an early notification of admission. For study programmes starting on 1 September, students need to apply between 1 October and 1 April. Citizens from EU countries, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Monaco, Norway, Vatican or Switzerland may also apply between 1 April and 1 June, but admission cannot be guaranteed. 6. The Admission Committee will make an admission decision within 3 weeks after having received the complete file. Admission will be granted on the condition that by the starting date of the study programme the applicant will have satisfied the knowledge and skills requirements referred to in Clause 2.3, as evidenced by certificates of qualifications. 7. The applicant will receive written notification that he/she has been admitted to the degree programme and a particular study programme. The possibility to appeal to the Examinations Appeals Board is pointed out in this notification.
