2.3	<p><b>Colloquium Doctum</b></p> <p>The entrance examination described in Article 7.29 of the Higher Education and Research Act concerns the following subjects at pre-university secondary (VWO) level: English and Dutch, and no more than two of the following subjects at pre-university secondary (VWO) level: German, Economics, French, History and Latin.</p>
3.1	<p><b>Purpose of the degree programme</b></p> <p>From the first year of the Bachelor's degree, students are familiarised with the theory and practice of academic research.</p> <p>1. <u>The programme aims to provide:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• knowledge, skills and understanding in the field of History, and the acquisition of the exit qualifications outlined in the second paragraph;</li><li>• general academic education, defined as the development of competencies (knowledge, skills and attitudes) with respect to:<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- academic modes of thought, conduct and communication;</li><li>- using relevant academic tools and instruments;</li><li>- academic and other forms of communication in the language in which the programme is taught;</li><li>- application of specific field-related knowledge within a broader academic, philosophical and sociocultural context;</li><li>- codes of conduct applicable during students' studies and academic careers in general;</li></ul></li><li>• preparation for an ongoing academic career;</li><li>• preparation for professional practice:<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- by relating knowledge of the past to current events;</li><li>- through an introduction to the labour market.</li></ul></li></ul> <p>2. <u>Graduates:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. have knowledge and an understanding of the past;</li><li>2. are aware of the theories and methods used in the field, and can apply them in research practice;</li><li>3. can clearly explain acquired insights to readers or listeners;</li><li>4. can apply historical knowledge and research results to answer practical questions;</li><li>5. possess knowledge and skills sufficient for completing a Master's degree programme.</li></ol>
3.2	<p><b>Programme format</b></p> <p>The BA History is a full-time programme.</p>
3.3	<p><b>Programme language</b></p> <p>1. The programme is offered in Dutch and English.</p>

<p><b>3.5</b></p>	<p><b>Major</b></p> <p><b>Students starting on 1 September 2016:</b></p> <p>Students starting on 1 September 2016 must choose one of the following two tracks as their major:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. History;</li> <li>2. International relations in historical perspective.</li> </ol> <p>Students then choose a specialisation from among those offered within the relevant track (see also the Curriculum (appendix 1)).</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The programme includes one section (the Major) with a study load of 120 credits in History subjects.</li> </ol> <p>2a) The components specified under 1 in the Appendix with a total study load of 67.5 credits are compulsory in the Major (including the dissertation, see also paragraph 3).</p> <p>2b) The 'specialisations' in the Major are specified under 2 in the Appendix. Students choose one of these specialisations, each of which has a total study load of 30 credits.</p> <p>2c) The 'academic context subjects' in the Major are specified under 3 in the Appendix. These subjects relate partially to the academic and social context of the programme. Students choose three of these components, with a total study load of 22.5 credits:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 7.5 credits at introductory level (1) in the Faculty of History and Art History;</li> <li>• 7.5 credits at advanced level (3) in the Faculty of History and Art History;</li> <li>• 7.5 credits at introductory level (1) from the list of academic context subjects outside the Faculty as stated in Appendix 3 (Article 3.5) – Academic context subjects.</li> </ul> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>3. At least 45 credits' worth of the components of the programme within the major (core profiles, specialisations, academic context subjects and dissertation) must be at the advanced level (3).</li> </ol>
