The resource curse and ethnic groups: This project reexamines the resource curse. Specifically, we analyze the distribution of resources between ethnic groups and how this affects the composition of governments and the outbreak of civil war and secession attempts. We employ novel dataset on resources like oil, gas and diamonds and combine them with data about ethnic groups to answer the research questions. This project will enable the student to strongly improve their own research skills and learn a lot about ethnic groups and conflict. They will be directly involved in an ongoing research project and be able to experience various stages of the research process from deriving hypotheses to data gathering and processing, and the empirical implementation. In addition, they will enhance their skills in widely used software programs. Number of places available: 1 per semester.
