academic preparation

I did not partake in any academic preparation.

language preparation

I did not partake in any language preparation either - the language of instruction at Charles University is English.

finances

I cannot give an extensive overview of the average monthly living cost in Prague as it differs a lot depending on how much you party etc. Next to that my exhange took place during a period of tremendous inflation due to the coronacrisis and the war in Ukraine. My private student accommodation in the city center (next to Muzeum and the central station, which is about the most central location you can get) was about 390 euros a month. This was a bedroom in a shared student flat of 5 people. You can get cheaper (150 euros a month for the dorms) and more expensive flats. The pricies of groceries are comparable to the Netherlands. Restaurants, bars and clubs are super cheap, as many might know. Public transport is 5,5 euro a month in Prague for students.

STUDY ABROAD PERIOD

study programme (content and organisational issues)

The study level was definitely lower than at UU. Three out of my four courses were masters courses and it was not that hard to receive full marks for them. I also followed political science courses next to my human geography courses, these were harder than the human geography courses. Do not put a lot of effort in choosing courses before going on Erasmus - this it what I did. It's not worth the effort. You're going to change all your courses when you arrive due to overlap and you have two weeks to still switch courses.

academic quality of education activities

On average lower than UU level yet really depends on the courses you're taking. There are big differences in quality between the different courses. I would advice you to follow a lot of different courses in the first two weeks (while you can still change) and then choose the ones you like most.

counselling & support at receiving university abroad

Counselling was okay, they always answered my questions. Sometimes it took a few days.

transfer of credits

Don't know yet. I still have to transfer them.

STUDENT LIFE

welcome & orientation programme

There was an introduction day for all Erasmus students of the Faculty of Science. I'd advice you to attend this day, you get a lot of information and a tour through campus. You can also already meet some people! The Erasmus club also present themselves - they organize some activities throughout the semester.

accommodation

I did not live at the dorms. I only know they were far out of the city mostly (40 min public transport) and did not always hear the best stories about the quality of living there. They are cheap however and you can make a lot of friends at the dorms.

leisure & culture

If you're going on Erasmus to meet people from different countries and cultures - you should definetly choose Prague. There's so much to do. Big Erasmus organizations (different ones), every day there are
