study programme (content and organisational issues)

I really liked the Human Geography courses that were available at Charles University. The first two weeks we got the time to try a lot of different courses and decide which ones we really want to do: this was very handy, because sometimes courses seemed more/less fun on the website, while the reality was super different. I really liked that a lot of my courses were about Czech Republic and Prague itself: in this way, you learned a lot about the country and the city.

academic quality of education activities

The quality differs per course, but in general the quality is fine. It is definitely more easy than the courses I took in Utrecht. We did a few fieldtrips which were very interesting and educational!

counselling & support at receiving university abroad

Altough it definitely takes longer to get documents signed via mail than in Utrecht, the support is still fine. You can also go to the Erasmus Office in person, but I never managed to find the office as it is quite hard to find.

transfer of credits

Charles University works with ECTS so the transfer is not a big deal.

welcome & orientation programme

We had a Orientation Day in the week before the start of the semester. This day was very informative in terms of which documents you need to upload etc. I also met a lot of new people on this day which is super fun!

accommodation

I found my room via Facebook. I had a lucky shot as I had super nice flatmates who became my friends, a super nice apartment in Prague 7 (a good neighbourhood) and for not much money (345 euro/month). Looking for a flat yourself is really worth trying in my opinion. You can also fix super cheap accomodation via the university: however, these dormitories are super far away from the city, dirty and you have to sleep with someone else in one room.

leisure & culture

As the time you need to study is less than I am used to in Utrecht, I had a lot of spare time. I did a lot of nice activities and trips with my friends, both within the city and outside of the city (and even in other countries!). (Public) transport is super cheap so you are super free to go wherever you want. Going out in Prague is also amazing (and cheap beer!).

Go on (day)trips, try to avoid the 'tourist' clubs/places and have fun with your friends!
